Welcome to the Northern Ireland Sustainable Energy Programme (NISEP).

NISEP is all about helping homes and businesses in Northern Ireland become more energy efficient whilst reducing carbon emissions.

How we help: NISEP is administered by Energy Saving Trust on behalf of the Utility Regulator. Scheme managers registered under NISEP comply with terms and conditions set out by the Utility Regulator and are responsible for scheme delivery.

Timeframe: The NISEP year runs from 1 April 2026 to 31 March 2027, or until funds are exhausted. Funds are limited for each scheme, and scheme managers will manage waiting lists, where schemes are oversubscribed.

Who is eligible for the programme?

There are a few things to consider, such as your income, where you live, and/or

if you are a homeowner, tenant, or a non-domestic/commercial property. This guide will summarise each scheme's eligibility criteria.

What is needed to apply? Where applicable, you will be asked to provide evidence to verify, (including but not limited to) household income, property ownership and consent from all owners for the works to proceed. Additionally, a building survey will be conducted to assess whether the property is technically suitable for each measure. This survey ensures compliance with current building regulations, industry best practice standards, and NISEP requirements as part of the application process.

NISEP offers a Whole House Solution and therefore when a heating system is being installed, both loft and wall insulation, should also be installed (where suitable for the property and if required).

At the application stage, you will be asked to confirm whether you have been accepted for any other grant-funded programme, or if you have received a grant for the same measure in previous years.

If you have previously had an application approved under any other grant

programme, for example NIHE's Affordable Warmth Programme, for the same measure at the same property, you will not be eligible for NISEP funding.

Additionally, if you have received a grant within the last 15 years for the same measure at the same property, you are also not eligible for NISEP funding (exceptional circumstances may be considered including where boilers are broken beyond viable economic repair).

How to use this document: Check out the contents table below for an overview and get in touch with the relevant scheme manager who will take you through the application process and any specific terms and conditions which may vary between schemes.

This guide is designed to help you quickly find the information you need. You can browse through the full document section by section, or you can use the contents page to jump straight to a specific scheme. Simply click on the scheme name in the contents page, and you'll be taken directly to its full details.

There's also a **glossary** at the end of this document that explains the terms used.

Please note: Most schemes have their own set of vulnerability criteria and income thresholds to identify qualifying households. In general, NISEP schemes are targeted at households who do not qualify for assistance from other government schemes such as Affordable Warmth.

Where demand is higher than funding available, a vulnerability matrix may be used to prioritise applicants.

Customers in areas where natural gas is not available, and have no existing central heating, a solid fuel fire or electric room heater (which is used as the main heat

source), can only convert to other forms of electric heating.

Flat roof properties are ineligible for loft insulation under NISEP. Self-build / new build properties including new extensions are also not eligible for NISEP funding.

Glossary

Loft insulation	Loft insulation is a layer of fibre that is rolled out in the roof space to cut down heat loss through the roof. A quarter of heat is lost through the roof if not insulated. Insulating your loft or attic is an effective way to reduce heat loss and reduce your heating bills.
Cavity wall insulation	About a third of all the heat lost in an uninsulated home escapes through the walls. By properly insulating cavity walls, you will save energy and cut costs off your heating bill. Many cavity walls can be insulated by injecting insulation material into the cavity from the outside. A building survey will be completed to determine if this type of insulation is suitable for your property.
Solid wall insulation	If your home was built before the 1920s, its external walls are probably solid walls rather than cavity walls. Solid walls have no gap, so they can't be filled with cavity wall insulation. A building survey will be completed to determine the best solution for your property however there are two main ways to insulate solid walls; internal wall insulation is done by fitting rigid insulation boards to the wall, or by building a stud wall filled in with insulation material such as mineral wool fibre. Or External wall insulation is carried out which involves fixing a layer of insulation material to the wall, then covering it with a special type of render (plasterwork) or cladding. The finish can be smooth, textured, painted, tiled, panelled, pebbledashed, or finished with brick slips.
LED bulbs	Energy efficient lighting helps lower electricity bills and carbon dioxide emissions, all without reducing the quality of light in our homes.
Reflective radiator panels	Reflective radiator panels are easily fixed behind your radiators, they reflect heat from the radiator back into the room, instead of letting the heat out through an external wall.
Air source heat pump	An air source heat pump (sometimes referred to as an air-to-water heat pump) transfers heat from the outside air to water. This in turn heats rooms in your home via radiators or underfloor heating. It can also heat water stored in a hot water cylinder for your hot taps, showers, and baths. The air source heat pump is powered by electricity so this would decrease your carbon footprint considerably as you would be using a less carbon intensive fuel unlike oil or gas.

Low-flow / eco shower head	A low-flow/eco shower head ensures the shower head will use less water but will still have the same pressure and feel as before. It is not compatible with every shower however.
Smart heating controls	Smart heating controls are advanced control systems for central heating. Smart controls are connected to the internet and offer more functionality than conventional heating controls. Some models can enable you to use your smart phone to control the heating when you're not at home. Others can learn your habits and adjust the settings to match, by tracking where you are using your smartphone location it will turn on the heating system to heat the house/hot water in time for your return.
Hot water tank jacket	Insulating water tanks reduces the amount of heat lost through the tank, so you spend less money heating water up, and hot water stays hotter for longer.
Chimney draught excluder	A chimney draught excluder is a handy device fitted inside the chimney or around the fireplace, to stop the warm air going up and the cold draughts coming back down and into the room.
Solar panels or photovoltaics (PV)	Solar panels, or photovoltaics (PV), capture the sun's energy and convert it into electricity to use in your home. Installing solar panels lets you use free, renewable, clean electricity to power your appliances. You can sell extra electricity to the grid or store it for later use.
Battery storage	Electric batteries help you make the most of renewable electricity sources like Solar Panels, for example. You can store electricity generated during the day by solar panels in an electric battery. You can use this stored electricity for powering a heat pump and other appliances when your solar panels are no longer generating electricity.
MCS (Microgeneration Certification Scheme)	This certification body quality assures and provides consumer protection for renewable technology installations, such as air source heat pumps, solar panels and battery storage etc. Renewable technologies installed under NISEP will require installers to be registered with MCS to ensure installers are competently installing quality measure(s) and comply with industry standards. You can find more information on their website at mcscertified.com

Energy Performance Certificate (EPC)	For NISEP schemes installing air source heat pumps an EPC will be carried out by an accredited domestic energy assessor pre and post installation. An EPC measures a property’s energy efficiency and carbon emissions. It provides a rating from A (most efficient) to G (least efficient). The EPC carried out post installation should highlight an improvement in the energy efficiency rating of the property. An EPC is required in the process of selling, buying or building a house.
Non-ERP compliant	ERP, or the Energy-Related Products Directive, applies to all products that use energy. The ERP was introduced to ensure manufacturers of these products are doing everything they can to reduce their products’ impact on the environment. ERP ensures clarity for consumers – allowing them to choose the most energy-efficient products, reduce their carbon emissions and save money on energy bills.
Gross income	Relates to income received per household including all benefits, salary etc before tax.
Northern Ireland Housing Executive leaseholder	This refers to a homeowner or private tenant who owns or privately rents a property within a site where the Housing Executive owns the communal areas, such as walls, hallways, roof space, and similar shared spaces.
Current waiting list	Please note that as demand is high for certain NISEP schemes and grants are allocated on a first come first served basis, the scheme you wish to apply for may be oversubscribed and already have a waiting list in place. This is noted on the list of schemes as ‘current waiting list’. Scheme managers will also be able to advise on the current status of individual schemes.
Closed scheme	This scheme is fully subscribed to and is no longer accepting new applicants. A waiting list is not available.
